# Special Campaign Update

The goals of the Special Campaign were to raise \$1,100,000; \$825,000 for the steeple debt, \$175,000 for the mortgage on the Lower Meetinghouse renovation, and \$100,000 for the "futures fund."

To date, campaign pledges are \$761,250. Adding the weathervane proceeds, this totals \$1,061,250. We are close to making our goal! If you are new to FRS and want to make a pledge to the Special Campaign, please contact Kristen Fehlhaber, <a href="mailto:campaign@frsuu.org">campaign@frsuu.org</a>.

Special campaign pledge payments received at this time total \$508,109.12. If you haven't made a first payment toward your three-year Special Campaign pledge, please do so before June 30, 2019.

This shows the current balance of the steeple debt and the great progress that has been made in its reduction.

Total Steeple-related debt \$825,000 (2/1/2018)

Payments made: -\$125,000 (repayment of unsecured loan)

-\$250,000 (repayment of LOC from pledges)

-\$300,000 (repayment of LOC from sale of weathervane)

\$150,000 remaining in line of credit (6/6/19)

In addition, \$24,000 has been paid toward the Lower Meetinghouse mortgage.

Last year, on the recommendation of the Finance Committee, the Parish Board agreed to hold back 10% of Special Campaign pledges and designate them for the portion of the campaign that was for the "futures fund". That amount is being held aside and will grow as the campaign nears its goal.

### Relating to Article 3 -Bylaws

ARTICLE IX

**Standing Committees** 

Finance Committee

Section 7. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for raising all the funds necessary for the maintenance of the Church and the conduct of its affairs; for conducting the annual canvass; for oversight of a planned giving program, and for assisting the staff in the preparation of the annual budget for approval by the Parish Board before its presentation at the annual meeting.

Section 8. The Finance Committee shall be responsible for lay oversight of the budget planning and performance and will advise the Parish Board as it deems advisable.

Section 9. The Finance committee shall be led by the Finance Committee Chair, who will serve as a member of the Parish Board.

...

#### ARTICLE XIV

#### Suspension

Specified parts of the Society's Constitution and By-laws may be suspended for a specified limited period, not to exceed one year, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present at a duly called meeting of the Parish. The quorum necessary for suspension of the Constitution and By-laws shall be twenty percent (20%) of the voting membership or 60 members, whichever is greater.

To guide our future, it is time to revisit and renew our Mission and Vision.


- The Parish Board wants to engage a consultant help the congregation with this work.
